OMH includes a focus on providing hope and recovery for children with serious emotional disturbances; ILCs teach skills required for independent living, and provide other services including advocacy, counseling, support groups, assistance with housing, and referrals; and the OCFS provides a system of family support, juvenile justice, childcare and child welfare services that promote safety and well-being.

Participants are encouraged to come with questions and leave with answers to “What’s next?” in their young adults’ transition to adulthood.
