

Make Community Connections

Outreach to Local Nonprofit:

Who is in your community?

Create meaningful projects.

Skills Internet Research Email Phone Calls

Ask what their needs are, design projects to fit their needs.

- Animal Shelter: dog treats/toys, no-sew beds
- Food Pantries/Homeless shelters: sock bundles, food drives
- Clothes Closet: sort, fold, package hygiene kits
- Head start: make literacy kits for head start, collect books
- Veterans/Military: make cards care packages
- Seniors: make cards, engage in virtual game
- Non-Profit Volunteer Managers- Volunteer appreciation gifts/cards




