WIHD BY THE NUMBERS

WIHD provides services to vulnerable children and their families

WIHD's child welfare programs provided over **6,000 encounters** with **303 children** and **108 birth, foster and adoptive families**.

WIHD's Children's Advocacy Center conducted close to **300 evaluations of suspected physical and/or sexual abuse** of children in Westchester County.

WIHD provides direct services for people with **Intellectual and/or Developmental Disabilities and their families**. These services include: primary health care, specialty health care, dental services, speech and hearing, assistive technology, behavioral health, service brokerage, and early intervention service coordination.
