
Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) has become common nomenclature across most organizations today.

## WIHD's Mobile Medical Unit Hits the Road

WIHD is committed to increasing access to critical health services for individuals with disabilities. To further this mission, **we acquired a customized Mobile Medical Unit to allow delivery of care where the majority of our clients reside** thanks to generous funding from the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation and the J.E. & Z.B. Butler Foundation. The Mobile Medical Unit will be hitting the road in 2024 providing primary care, podiatry, occupational therapy, laboratory testing, and vaccinations to people with disabilities living in Westchester and Hudson Valley group residential programs. People with disabilities living in group residential programs often miss appointments at healthcare centers because of inadequate transportation and limited driver staffing. Residential programs indicated that a solution like WIHD's Mobile Medical Unit will help their residents get the care and health education they need more easily.



# Hear from Our Client Ambassador Jarely

Jarely's journey began when she was only 8 years old and her hearing loss was discovered during a routine hearing screening at her school. Her family found that WIHD was the best place to take her for help.

Jarely's journey has had its ups and downs, but her services through WIHD have remained constant. The very same audiologists at WIHD who gave Jarely her initial hearing exam 15 years ago are still monitoring her hearing, evaluating her hearing aids, ensuring she receives academic accommodations, and upgrading her technology to ensure she has the latest, including Bluetooth-enabled aids that hook up to her phone and video streaming.

She feels empowered to pursue her dreams. Jarely embodies the future that WIHD envisions -- that all people, including people with disabilities and vulnerable children, live fulfilling lives on the terms that work for them.

## Allied Health Services Evolving and Growing

WIHD's vision is to create Allied Health Services as an umbrella to house Assistive Technology, Speech and Language, Audiology, and Occupational Therapy. In 2023, we began to merge our Assistive Technology Program with the Speech & Hearing Center. Through this consolidation, we intend to streamline patient care and create a more coordinated and efficient set of services.

We increased staff with specific expertise, including in  **bilingual speech-language, feeding, auditory aural rehab, adult aphasia**, and working with clients with complex communication needs who would benefit from augmentative and alternative communication (AAC). And the occupational therapy team began to expand beyond assistive technology services, to include **patient education, life skills, executive function and more**. We are looking forward to completing this integration and expanding our expertise in 2024.



## My Disability Roadmap Wins an Emmy Award!

Dan Habib and Samuel Habib of WIHD won a News & Documentary Emmy Award for their short film,

**My Disability Roadmap.** Their New York Times Op-Docs film was honored at the September 27, 2023, ceremony held at the Palladium Times Square Theater in New York City. In the film, the father-son filmmaking team document the path to adulthood for Samuel, who lives with a rare neurodevelopmental disorder caused by a mutation in a gene known as GNAO1. Samuel seeks out guidance from America's most rebellious disability activists in his journey to learn how they built full adult lives — as a roadmap for himself and others. The film is being aired across the globe to promote inclusion, acceptance, and rights for people with disabilities. The full-length version of their film, *The Ride Ahead*, will be released in 2024.

## Self-Advocates Leading the Way

### Leadership Program

In an innovative collaboration, WIHD's Self-Advocacy group has partnered with Volunteer NY! in the design and delivery of a leadership program specifically for adults with developmental disabilities.



**This program is aimed to define leadership, highlight various leadership roles and traits, develop fundamental skills, and enhance motivational communication,** all tailored to the unique needs of its participants. The goal is to foster a new generation of influential leaders who will drive positive change within the disability community.

This pioneering effort demonstrates the potential of targeted leadership training to harness the unique strengths of individuals with developmental disabilities, promising a brighter, more inclusive future.

### The Speaker's Network

Access and inclusion in employment, healthcare, housing, and entertainment are important to everyone, including people with disabilities. WIHD's Self-Advocacy team has developed a Speaker's Network of individuals with disabilities who want to influence discussions and policies on these topics and others.

**This program embodies the motto "nothing about us without us," which underlines the importance of involving those with lived experiences in crafting solutions.**

Over the last four years, this initiative has built a network of over twenty speakers, enriching discussions with their unique insights and promoting a fuller understanding of disability.

## Alpha Kappa Alpha Ensures Children in Child Welfare are Prepared for School

We couldn’t be more grateful for the dedicated members of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. who continuously donate their time, resources, and talents to WIHD. This year, they again donated backpacks, school supplies, and winter coats to children participating in WIHD’s Child Welfare programs in Westchester County. These were gifted to the children in our Every Family Counts program, which supports families as they are reunifying after foster care as well as Project IMPACT, which provides parenting support to adults with intellectual disabilities whose children are at risk of foster care placement.

*We received approximately 30 backpacks, 45 school supply kits which contained a variety of schools supplies and 41 coats.*



## An Enduring Legacy in Our Children's Advocacy Center

The Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) at WIHD is where children and teens with concerns for abuse are evaluated in a multi-disciplinary manner including medical, law enforcement, child protective services, and mental health. The goal of the CAC team is to provide a coordinated response in a neutral, safe and child-friendly environment. Established in 2002, WIHD's forensic medical programs cover most of the Hudson Valley.

Dr. Beth Reiman retired after 35 years at WIHD. She led the CAC with her unique and impactful skillset and compassionate nature. She leaves behind a legacy of modeling patience, balance, objectivity, hard-work, personal and professional growth, and respect. Her presence will be sincerely missed, but her impact will be felt for decades to come.

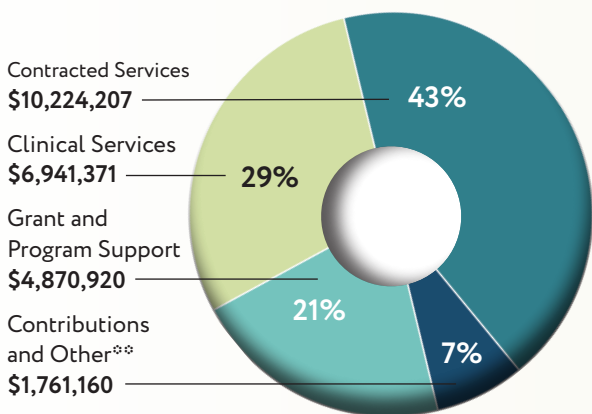

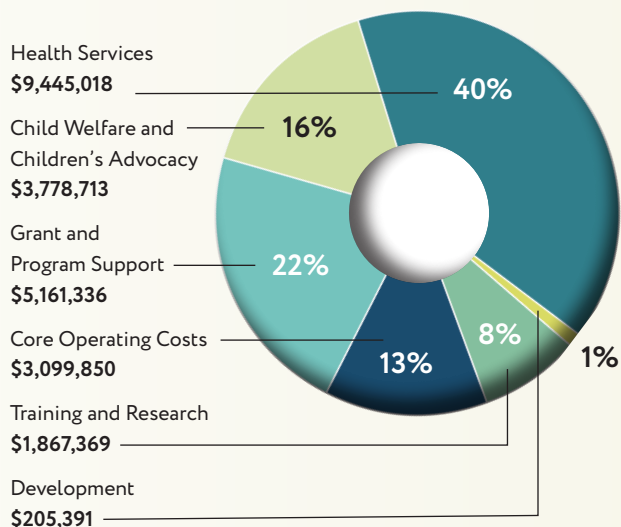
